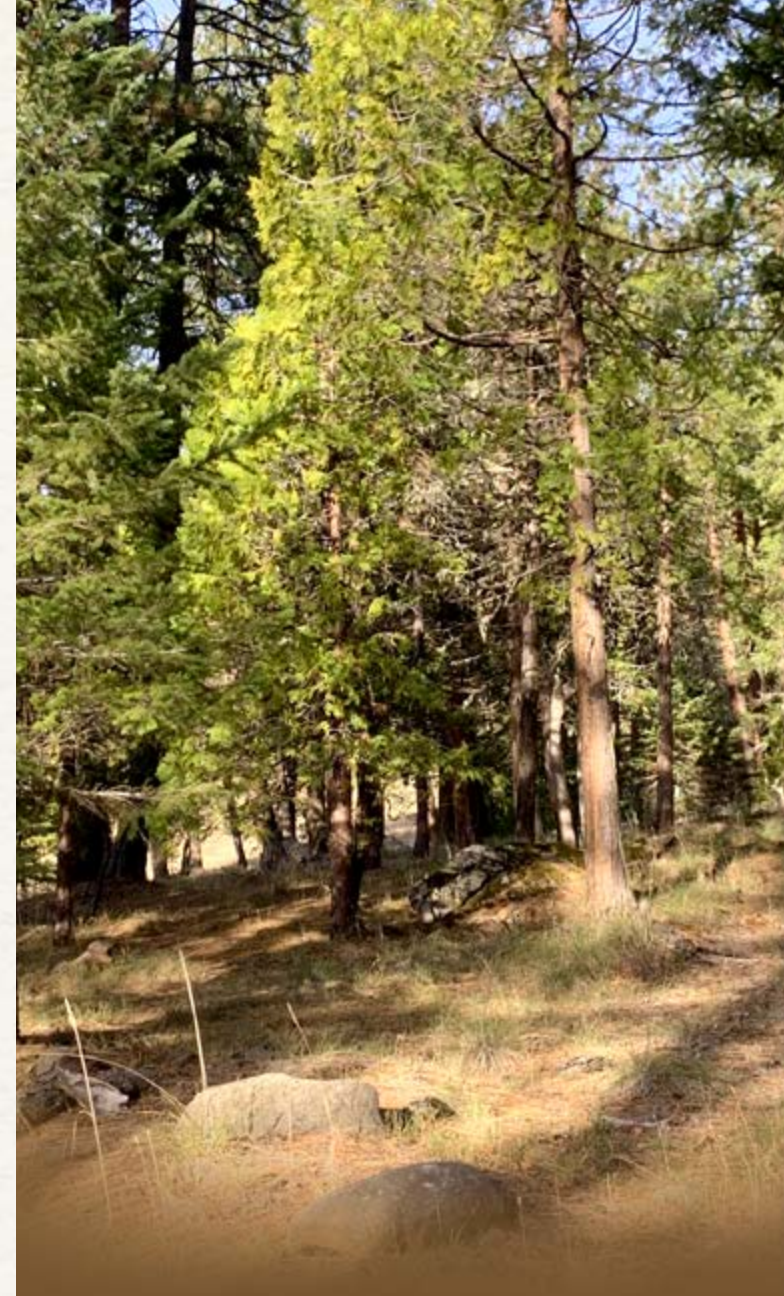

Forest Pet Cemetery joins  
The Forest Conservation  
Burial Ground at Willow-Witt  
Ranch in the Cascade-Siskiyou  
National Monument  
near Ashland.

In this serene setting of mature conifers, oaks and native grasses, your family can celebrate the life of a deceased or lost pet. Our pets provide companionship and unconditional love; this bond continues after their death.

Willow-Witt Ranch is a complex 445-acre ecosystem at 5000' elevation in the Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument. Suzanne Willow and Lanita Witt have worked with nature since 1985 to restore diverse healthy forests and wetlands and improve wildlife habitat through stewardship, conservation, and regenerative organic agriculture.



Pets can be buried directly into the earth, in biodegradable cloth shrouds or cardboard boxes, or in simple wooden caskets at extra cost. Cremated remains can be buried directly into the earth, in biodegradable urns, or scattered. Whole body graves will be marked with bronze survey markers. Native stone markers are also available, or you can honor your pet with a plaque on a memorial stone wall.
